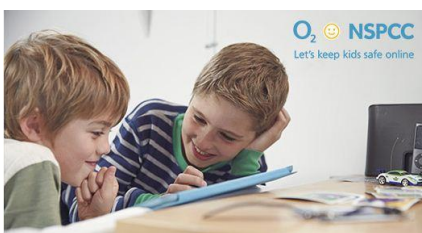
The **Underwear Rule** is a simple way that parents and carers can help keep children safe from sexual abuse – without using scary words or even mentioning sex.

We will listen to your concerns, offer advice and support and can take action on your behalf if a child is in danger. You can remain anonymous. All communications will be recorded and we keep records for 15 years.
